
KDB MISSION & APPROACH

Our mission is to Promote Clean, Attractive and Sustainable Communities through empowerment, community partnerships, regular maintenance and educational opportunities.





- Attend 3 HOA/Civic Association meetings per month

EVENTS OVERVIEW

Community Cleanups (30 recorded)

Community group partners don our vests and pickup sticks to clean litter from the streets in their area with their neighbors.

- 200 participants
- Barriers to Beauty Painting (2 recorded)

Groups add artistic value to otherwise plain, but functional cement blocks KDB crews place to prevent dumping in a given area.

- 48 participants
- Rain Barrel Workshops (1 recorded)

Partners learn about local water conservation through the creation of a rain barrel that they then take to install in their home or business.



SNAPFINGER WOODS DRIVE INITIATIVE



In recent years, this corridor has experienced higher than average litter volume. Keep DeKalb Beautiful is promoting community based cleanups and other treatments in the Snapfinger Woods Corridor between Snapfinger Road/Parkway & DeKalb Medical Parkway through the newly extended time of June 2018. Secondary cleanups will occur on Wesley Chapel, Miller Rd, Panola Rd and DeKalb Medical Parkway.

This initiative is intended to reduce litter through educational outreach while breathing new life into existing groups and recruitment of new groups. Please join us for our latest installation, taking place on Saturday, June 16!

DEKALB SHERIFF DEPARTMENT/STATE COURT MONTHLY OVERVIEW, MAY 2018






